PROBLEM STATEMENT

57% of the U.S. workforce is made up of **women**, but only **26%** of technology-related positions are held by women

For women of color - black, Latina, and Native American women - 4% of the technology related positions are held by women of color — almost none of which are senior leadership roles

IMPACT

 Without highly skilled diverse employees who can contribute to product development and innovation, we run the risk of building and selling products that can perpetuate a bias and not meet the needs of all consumers.


> In the community, diversity is important to ensuring that we focus on equality for all.

REASON

- The lack of role models. There are very, *very* few women and minorities in the higher ranks of tech companies.
- Gender stereotype of 'boys being better at science and maths'.
- Lack of a talent pool. Figures show that fewer women are studying technology-based subjects meaning employers have fewer women to choose from when recruiting.
- Lack of awareness.






