Site Development Grants



The Madison County Economic Development Authority received 2 site development grants toward the construction of a 300-foot access road leading into the Madison Megasite.



The road will provide an access point into the site to attract new prospects and boost interest in the site, which will lead to capital investment and job creation.

Reunion Parkway Phase 2 & 3 Bozeman Road to U.S. Highway 51

• Residential and commercial development in Madison County is booming with an expected 18,000 new citizens over the next ten years.

• Reunion Parkway Phase 2 and 3 will create critical jobs and tax revenue for Madison County by providing access to 880 acres of economic development opportunities. • The county has completed Reunion Parkway Phase 1 (MS 463 to Bozeman Rd) at a cost of \$14 million.

• Reunion Parkway Phase 3 (Parkway East to U.S. Highway 51) is in the right-of-way acquisition phase and can be ready for construction in 2020.

• Reunion Parkway Phase 2 (Bozeman Road to Parkway East) is vitally needed as the critical link between MS 463 to I-55 and to U.S. 51 to reduce traffic on other area east-west corridors (MS 463 and Gluckstadt Road) that are currently over capacity.

• Reunion Parkway Phase 2 will consist of a new multi-lane roadway and bridge over I-55 from Bozeman Road to Parkway East.


• MDOT will connect to Reunion Parkway Phase 2 with an interchange when widening I-55 from MS 463 to Gluckstadt Road is funded.

- The estimated project cost for Reunion Parkway Phase 2 is \$25 million.
- The estimated project cost for Reunion Parkway Phase 3 is \$10.2 million.

• The county will complete the Phase 2 environmental assessment in August 2019 per MDOT/FHWA guidelines and will begin engineering design immediately following that approval.

• The county currently has all required matching funds for the Reunion Parkway Phase 2 and 3 projects.


