A recent international study compared 11 nations on health care quality, access,


efficiency, and equity, as well as indicators of healthy lives such as infant mortality.





### Premium Has Grown 4.5x Inflation For 14 Years


Cumulative Increases in Health Insurance Premiums, Workers' Contributions to Premiums, Inflation, and Workers' Earnings, 1999-2013





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

### **SOCIAL DETERMINATES OF HEALTH**




### **INDIVIDUAL DETERMINATES OF HEALTH**

The MSBGH will lead and foster a community of Mississippi employers that will seek to continuously improve the quality and cost effectiveness of health and health care through shared solutions.




# WHAT WE DO


